Matched Saving Program Creates Opportunity for Home Purchase

Two years ago in pursuit of her dream of owning a home, Caressa opened an Oregon IDA account with CCHFH which provides a five to one matched funds for low income families saving to purchase a home.



Caressa diligently saved every month toward her savings plan goal and completed required classes in financial education and home buying. This past spring, she purchased a house in St. Helens and was finally able to move her daughter to their own home. They are both looking forward to a having this stable foundation from which to grow for many years. We are proud of her accomplishments and excited to enroll more local prospective homeowners.

Columbia County Habitat for Humanity is the only provider in Columbia County for the IDA program for home purchase. We are able to offer applicants currently saving for closing costs a realistic way to achieve their home purchase goal. Pairing this program with the USDA 502 Direct Home Loan program, which does not require a down payment, opens a pathway to homeownership for those who have historically been turned

away from the Habitat for Humanity program for being slightly over the income limits. The same program can also boost savings for home repair for homeowners below 80 percent of the Area Median Income.
